Greatest Convention in History of Race

Big Meeting To Be Staged At The 12th Regiment Armory By Universal Negro Improvement Association Monday Night, August 1st

BE IN LINE FOR THIS GREAT CONVENTION

FELLOW MEN OF THE NEGRO RACE, *Greeting:*

As President-General of the Universal Negro Improvement Association, I am directed to issue this final invitation to all divisions, branches and chapters of the Universal Negro Improvement Association, and to all churches, fraternal organizations, institutions, newspapers and clubs of the Negro race to attend the second International Convention of Negroes, to be held in New York City, N. Y., U. S. A., from the 1st to the 31st of August of the present year.

Each organization will send a delegate to represent its interest in this convention.

The convention is being held for the purpose of legislating for the future government of the Negro race of the world. Delegates will come from the 48 States of the American Union, from all the islands of the West Indies and all the countries of South and Central America and of Africa. Delegates must be in New York not later than Sunday, the 31st of July, so as to be at hand to join in the divine services to be held for the opening of the convention at 9:30 on the morning of the 1st of August, which services will be held in Liberty Hall, 120-148 West 138th street. All delegates must also be available to join in the parade that will march around the city of New York, starting from Liberty Hall in 138th street, and from the United Nations Building at 54-56 West 135th Street, New York City, on Monday, August 1st.

It is expected that 50,000 delegates will march in the parade. Bring your banners representing your organization or your club or your fraternity. Have your Red, Black and Green rosettes or buttons, so that there can be uniformity in the line of parade.

At 8 P. M. the convention will assemble for its official public opening at the 12th Regiment Armory at 62d street and Columbus avenue. Admittance to this public opening will be by ticket, which can be secured from the office of the New York Local of the Universal Negro Improvement Association at 56 West 135th street, New York City.

This convention will eclipse anything in the history of conventions. Negroes from every part of the world are already flocking into New York. Important legislation will be gone through for the 31 days and 31 nights of the sitting of the convention. The program for the development and emancipation of Africa will be discussed. The problem of the Civil Service of the Universal Negro Improvement Association will be discussed, as also important offices will be filled for the ensuing year.

All men of education and letters are asked to attend this convention. Come prepared to do the best you can to make the Universal Negro Improvement Association the power it ought to be. This is the only convention that represents the true spirit of Negroes everywhere. This is not a convention called by one man to suit his white master. This is a convention called by the people of the Negro race.

Negroes everywhere are asked to pray for the success of this convention. You must not only pray, but you must also work for its success. Whatsoever you can do during the entire month of August, helping the convention, we are expecting you to do. What will help us greatly by sending donations, and by sending also to buy shares in the Black Star Line. Send whatsoever you have to help the work of the Secretary-General of the Universal Negro Improvement Association, 56 West 135th Street, New York City, U. S. A.

Let us all unite to make this convention a success, because through the medium of this convention the Negro Improvement Association will be able to help the people of Negroes everywhere.
