TUSKEGEE HOSPITAL Many Positions Still Unfilled

(By the Associated Negro Press) WASHINGTON, D. C .-- It has been ficially announced that Dr. Charles M. Griffith has been made head o Veterans' Hospital, No. 91, at Tuskegee, thereby, supplanting Dr. Robert M. Stanley, who resigned and was sent to New Mexico, Dr. Griffith was first assistant to Stanley. Attention has been called by the Civil Service Commission to the fact that Negro applicants for the various positions have not materialized as rapidly as was hoped for. It is pointed out that there are many positions, both professional and civil, still unfilled and that Negro control will be delayed until qualified people have been secured and themselves competent to handle the various duties. The Veterans' Bureau indicates that the chief issue involve the best possible care of the pa tients, but that now the road is clean for Negro people to assume the various positions. It is up to the group to produce the applicants for places. ro physicians and civilians are being urged to apply and stand examina-


