# WEST AFRICAN CONDITIONS DESCRIBED

# Traveller Records His Coast of Africa

### By Clifford L. Lord

To the average man in the street the West Coast of Africa is almost an unknown country. He may talk of Cape coast Castle, Sierra Leone, or even Lagos, and say something about the white man's grave, or quote the old rhyme

concerning the dead fingers of the Bight of Benin, but beyond this his notions of the coast are somewhat knew little more than this myself before going there, but having gone there I have found out many realizable facts about our brother natives, and my ideas concerning that have been considerably en-

In the first place, the West Coast o Africa is not such a deadly place for Europeans as it is usually believed to be. Except you make it for yourself. it may not be exactly a health resort under present conditions, but it is a more desirable climate than in many other countries, especially during the winter months or the hot, burning summer days. It is the real honest-to-God climate for physical superiority. The moist heat induces free perspira-tion, which is good for your health. acting as a safety valve very much like a turkish bath dues in the cold countries.

### Sierra Leone

Talking about Sierra Leone, the sea is seldom if ever rough. You will find the most exceptional weather around tl ere: it has the Pacific skinned a mile for its smooth velour. I feel convinced from my own observtations and from what natives as well as some experienced white men have said to me that the faver among whites on the coast is not so much the fault of the climate as of the way they live. There is more good living than is good for the people in a tropical climate. Meals of several courses are served, consisting mostly of some preparation of flesh In a climate like that of West Africa a diet consisting of flesh-foods is mor irrational. Vegetables are very plent ful, but mangoes, oranges, bananas paw-paws, pineapples, yams, peanute avacado-pears, rice, coffe and coco are abundant. I want to call your at tention to the native grown rice in West Africa. It is of an excellent flavor and more nourishing than the im ported rice. I know, because I am a great lover of rice as a food.

### The Discriminating Mosquito

It is no wonder that the natives say that white men get fever out there. Of the question of mosquito bites causing fever, there seems to be a great diver sity of opinion. Whatever the truth may be, I cannot help thinking that mosquito bites are not so likely to cause fever in a person whose blood is a pure and healthy condition; but i through wrong living it become loaded with impurities then the malari germ will find a happy hunting ground therein to increase and multiply. I appears to me that the mosquito know the African from the white man be cause, in my stay, I can only remember of three mosquito visits, and they were friendly, merely whispering howde-do in my ears and returned from whence they came. That is to show you that even the mosquito is glad to see an 'old descendant return to his mother country

Nature is bountiful to the black man in West Africa, for she does not force him to struggle with her to obtain a Impressions Gained From Trip to West ing more to care for. But he is a different man on the West Coast today. For instance, he is looking into cultivation for wealth; also civilization; the spirit of commercialism is a terror to his brain that keeps him on his

daily study of being an independent Negro.

Fine Specimens of Manhood What impressed me more than any thing on the coast was the fine muscular development of the natives and the splendid work that they perform. Their dorsal muscles stand out in well rounded masses, two inches or more beyond the spine on both sides, forming a deep hollow between their arms an shoulders, a picture of muscular strength that would delight the heart of the sculptor. This muscular velopment, covered as it is with a dark skin, reminds one of the Greek and Roman bronze statues of athletes. The West African natives lend themselves well to adornment with ivory, gold and silver. Natives are sometimes seen wearing heavy bracelets of ivory, about six inches deep and half an inch thick often mounted with silver and with their names engraved thereon. This is particularly the fashion with the headsmen on the French Ivory It is interesting to note the differen

paddles used by the boatmen along the coast. The most common kind has a thick heavy stem with a broad threeointed blade, like a webbed foot, all

cut out in one solid piece. Sometimes boat crew will be seen with all the blades of their paddles painted a pale blue; it is pretty to see them rising and falling in unison as the crew paddles along. On the Ivory Coast a smaller paddle is used, the blade curving outwards and inwards, ending in a three-cornered point and painted with gaudy designs of red, white, blue, green and black. In the Sherbro district the paddles are longer in the handles and Chief of the Leeward Island Colony the blades are somewhat of an elongated heart shape Negro's Superiority in Africa

The status of the black man on th west coast of Africa, as regards his intercourse with the whites, is rather different from that of the black may of America. We are looked upon al most with loathing in America: se strong is the prejudice against color that we are scarcely considered fit to breathe the same air as the white man But on the coast the black man is rather differently treated, although even the Canadians and Americans carry with them the strong race preju dice to which they have been accus

tomed in their own countries. No mat ter how well educated and gentlemanl; a native may be, or what position he may hold, his color is enough for them he is a nig--, and to shake hands with him or to sit at the same table with him is to them a sore degradation This prejudice against mere colo to me ludicrous and mer seems heathenism. I have been asked this question more than once: "Do you think that you are as good as a white man?" and I have replied: "What is meant by good-good at what, or is what respect? In many things a black man is as good as a white man; in others he is better. Physically, taken as a race, he is superior to the white man, especially in West Africa, where the climate is too warm for much physical development for whites. The black man there is certainly the better man, for he is best fitted to the en-


