

LOOKING TO THE FUTURE, NEGROES MUST PREPARE NOW

Fellow Men of the Negro Race, Greeting:

Once again I desire to sound a warning to those of the race who still profess not to see the stark necessity for striking out along lines of nationhood for Negroes and building for themselves power and independence in our Godgiven land, Africa. Living as Negroes are in environments of studied hostility and feverish preparedness on the part of others, it is difficult to conceive what holds these super-optimists back. Be optimistic, if you must, but, in Heaven's name, prepare now against the day when your optimism shall be forced to take wings.

The programme of "Africa for the Africans, those at home and those abroad," which has been outlined by the Universal Negro Improvement Association is often maliciously misinterpreted by certain writers and speakers. The object of our organization is not to dump all Negroes in Africa, but to encourage all Negroes to help in the building up of Africa as a great Negro nation, so that those who desire to go to Africa, and live there under their own democracy, their own flag, will do so to their own ad-vantage.

All intelligent students of political and domestic science will readily admit that the future of the Negro outside of Africa spells ruin and disaster. Negroes must surround themselves with the help, political, moral and otherwise, of a strong Negro government. This government must be sufficiently strong to lend protection to Negroes anywhere and to compel the respect of all races and nations of the world.

Directing the Mass

As a first step toward the realization of its great objective, a strong Negro nation in Africa. the Universal Negro Improvement Association has organized into one great body millions of Negroes throughout the world. The association is now striving to properly advise, guide and direct this great mass of forward-looking Negroes in their march to nationhood. Numerous are the pitfalls which must be seen and avoided. With a fair measure of common sense and good judgment we will be able to pass through this very critical period with a minimum of disappointment and failure.

The masses of our people must try hard to learn how to discriminate between the true and the false. If we are not using our minds as well as our ears, it is very easy to be led off on a tangent. Listen well to those who lead, so that you may soon discover if they are saying one thing and doing another. There are some Negroes, who, because of their own personal purposes, seek to fool the race so as to be able to exploit us. This group gives no care as to

among our leaders means nothing else but ruin to the entire race. It is for the masses to cut away from such insincere men and women. We do, not want any division in the Negro race. But we must have truth. We must have honesty, and if our leaders will not give us truth and honesty, we must cut away from them and choose others to direct us.

Nation-Building a Big Task

The building of a nation is about as great a task as any race can undertake. We appeal for all to come in because all are necessary to the great programme. All are not prompted to join by the same motives. There are some members of the race who will never do anything except defraud, rob and exploit others. It is one of the duties of the Universal Negro Improvement Association to warn the masses of our people against the grafting and designing self-seekers among us who would capitalize and utilize the innocence of those whom they are professing to uplift.

The programme of the Universal Negro Improvement Association is a practical, a live programme. No Negro can join the organization without receiving immediate benefit from the lessons which are being taught to instruct, advise and strengthen its members. The masses of Negroes are clamoring for marching orders. They are evolving their own leadership. They what the future holds. This shortsightedness I are insisting on honesty of purpose and true

racial integrity and they will be satisfied with nothing else.

Make Use of All Opportunities The Universal Negro Improvement Association encourages the Negro to do anything which is for the uplift of the individual or the race. The association does not teach Negroes to discard or to throw away any opportunity. which may be beneficial to them. On the contrary, we say to all Negroes everywhere, seize all opportunities that come to you. But never forget that our success educationally, industrially and politically is based upon the protection of a nation founded by ourselves on the continent of Africa. Prejudice against the Negro will only die out when the Negro himself becomes a power sufficiently strong to compel the respect of the world.

Many of our people argue that the Negro can use his industrial wealth and his ballot to force the government to recognize him. But we must understand that the government is the people and that the majority of the people dictate the policy of the government. If the majority of the people are against a measure, a thing, or a race, then the government is impotent to protect that measure, that thing, or that race. If the Negro were to live in this western world for another five hundred years, he would still find himself outnumbered by superior numbers of other races.

Depending on a Broken Stick

Because of majority rule, the government of white nations will always be against the Negro. For the Negro to depend entirely upon the ballot and his industrial progress is like depending on a broken stick which will never support him in time of need. It sounds very foolish on the part of some of our so-called leaders to speak prejudicial to the great objective of the Universal Negro Improvement Association. It is not hard for the simplest mind to see that the Negro can never hope to hold up his head until he acquires a home of his own where he may match his mind with that of other races and demonstrate his ability to govern himself as other races are doing.

The Universal Negro Improvement Association desires the help, the co-operation of every Negro. We appeal to every Negro to come in and help. Every one can find a place on this great program. The movement belongs to the entire race. The program does not mean that every Negro must go to Africa. You may remain where you are and work for the cause of Africa. All of the white people in Europe did not come over to America to lay the foundation for this great Republic. Let us not stand by with our heads filled with a lot of foolish notions and lose sight of the only thing which will ever save the Negro from continued degradation and ultimate annihilation. LET'S PUT IT OVER

AFRICA, LAND OF OUR FATHERS, CONTINENT OF LIGHT THE NEGRO, IF HE WILLS, MUST COME INTO HIS OWN

Fellow Men of the Negro Race, Greeting:

I have to tender you my heartfelt thanks for the earnest efforts you are making to secure my release from a prison where persecution has confined ine. I desire to let you know that, whatever betide, I shall always treasure memories of the deep appreciation which you have manifested for service which I have been fortunate enough to render and which, I trust, shall prove to be a boon to this downtrodden race of ours.

This week I desire to speak to you about the Continent of Light-Africa. They would have you believe that Africa is the "Dark Continent." Africa is today the most brilliant continent on the face of the globe. It is the continent of light. There is no darkness about Africa. Africa is so much lit, that it is attracting the attention of the world. Like the moon and the sun, it attracts the world because of its brilliancy.

Africa Full of Light

Africa is full of light, I say, because gold is there. Africa is full of light because copper and tin and iron and coal and everything you can think of are there. And the white man seeks the light. That's why he is going to Africa. Yet they are still trying to camouflage you about the "Dark Continent."

I have nothing to hide. I have no camouflage. I have but one truth to tell where Africa is concerned. the land of my fathers. They never gave it to anybody, and by my rights, legal and moral, it belongs to me. cannot argue with the white man about Canada. I won't argue with the white man for a minute in an effort to convince him that America is mine. I won't argue with the Englishman for a minute telling him that Great Britain is mine. But I will spend eternity fighting with any man who wants to talk about Africa, because it is mine. Let the Canadians have Canada; let the Americans have America, and let us have Africa. Yes, we shall have Africa, or report to God the reason why.

Propaganda Will Not Deter

And in our endeavor to regain possession of our Godgiven land we shall be deterred by no obstacles. We shall count as naught the propaganda of the other fellow to keep us in a state of subjection. Propaganda has done more to defeat the good intentions of races and nations than even open warfare. Propaganda is a method used by organized people to convert others against their will, and we are suffering more than any other race in the world from propaganda-propaganda to destroy our hopes, to destroy our ambition, to destroy our confidence in life. The Universal Negro Improvement Association is surrounded with propa-

To destroy the usefulness of our organization, to prevent the success of our organization, to destroy the hope of this race of ours for freedom, for true liberty, propaganda has been organized to the effect that you will be so diverted, you will be so divided as to bring about confusion among yourselves, and in the confusion will come the success o the plan laid out by those who are organizing to keep us where we are until we are completely destroyed.

Known to Be Just

What do I mean by that? I mean this: that the Uni versal Negro Improvement Association stands out at this time on a platform of equity, of justice, of liberty, of freedom for the Negro. Everybody knows it to be a just cause. No one knows it better than those who robbed and exploited and murdered us for over three hundred years. They know it is the program sought by all peoples, and that it is the program that should be supported by all peoples who know themselves to be the creatures of God. But their purpose is not to let us into true freedom, true liberty, true democracy by ourselves, because they have always held us as slaves, and they will always keep us as slaves to suit their convenience, provided we let them do that. So as to keep us slaves, so as to be able to use us as they desire, until they feel that they can do completely without us, they have instigated, they have started, they have subsidized counterpropaganda, counter-movements, some of them having the same appearance as your own Universal Negro Improvement Association; movements that actually try to do the same thing you are trying to do; movements coming out with the same program you have in view. What is the idea? It is to divide and ultimately to destroy you. They know that without unity there can be no success. They, know well that with division among you, you will fight among yourselves, and therefore there will never come a conflict with them-that it, between us and them.

Support Negro Leadership

I want you to realize this that where your liberty, where your freedom is concerned, there should be but one policy for you, and that policy should be Negro leadership and Negro support of Negro leadership. Where other things are concerned, as religion, social life, or industrial life, we can afford to admit into association other races; but where your liberty is concerned, where your freedom is concerned, no one should be allowed but yourselves.

If you haven't liberty, and you are struggling for it, you will have to get it from someone; for someone is depriving you of it. How then can you afford to accept into your association, into your companionship, into your executive councils, men who have kept you from getting your liberty, and those who are opposed to the progress you are making for your liberty?


It is illogical. If Africa is to be freed from Europe she has got to be made free upon her own initiative, free from any alliance or aid from Europeans. Africans cannot expect Europe to help free Africa when Europe is the country that keeps Africa in subjection. It is illogical.

And so I appeal to the Negroes of the world to so work, the propaganda of the enemy notwithstanding, that they will bring back into the fold the continent of Africa which they have all but lost. The thing can be done, and it must be done. All that is needed is a single purpose, a common will. And with Unity as our watchword and God being our Helper we shall attain our objective.





His father maintained a court at Tetuan with the capable Mohammed ben-Azuz as Grand Vizier, and his territory extended for miles along the coast and into the highlands of the interior. Considerable of this domain has been occupied by the Riff tribesmen, and El Mehedi's efforts at government were nullified by the constant defiance of the spectacular chieftain, Abd-el-Krim.

The wily Riff leader never succeeded in capturing Tetuan. Spanish cannons and gunboats also kept Raisuli out of the city. It may be true, as has been reported, that Abd-el-Krim's break with Raisuli was due to the fact that Raisuli did not take Tetuan or deliver El Mehedi into his power and that Abd-el-Krim was tired of the fat old rascal's trickery. At least the Riff chieftain sent his men out to Raisuli's stronghold and under the very nose of the government brought him to

Ajdir, the Riffian capital, with the in-tention of hanging him. He sent word to Tetuan that other native dignitaries opposed him might suffer the same fate. The installation of the young Caliph

with such elaborate formalities may be a wise move on the part of Spain The Spanjards believe that it prove to the rebellious tribesmen that the Spanish Government will not oust their native government, and show to the world that Spain is endeavoring to live up to the provisions of the treaty It is also their belief that a descendant of the Prophet on the throne may influence enough Moslem tribesmen to abandon Abd-el-Krim to deflate completely his rebellion. 
