Fellow-Men of the Negro Race, Greeting:

The Universal Negro Improvement Association has reached the stage where it is causing the whole world to take it seriously. There is no one truth that is correctly understood and represented. Men have always differed in their interpretation of human programs and movements. We are not surprised, therefore, that with all that has been said outlining the purpose of this grand organization men are still disposed to look upon it with a great deal of suspicion, and others see in it all that is evil, refusing to admit the real good that emanates therefrom and which is sought in the interest of the Negro peoples of the world.

We are determined to take an uncompromising stand for the preservation of our race, the advancement of our political rights and securing posterity of our own from the dangers we have suffered in the past and the hardships we are undergoing in the present. Indeed, the whole Negro race is on trial in the test of the existence of the Universal Negro Improvement Association. If Negroes can be so thoughtless and inconsiderate and venal as to allow any harm or injury to be done to the Universal Negro Improvement Association, it will only be the settling once and for all of all the belief that the Negro will never rise beyond his present environment, because of his inability to initiate for himself, to stand by his own efforts, and to uphold his own principles.

No one will gainsay the fact that the Universal Negro Improvement Association is the strongest and greatest Negro movement in the world. If the Universal Negro Improvement Association cannot stand, then nothing else Negro will be able to stand against the onslaught of the ancient enemy. But the Universal Negro Improvement Association shall stand, and as firm as the solid Rock of Gibraltar, and nothing shall stand in the way of the program of this great organization. Its principles are too noble, too grand, too lofty to be destroyed by mere human power. Those who founded the Universal Negro Improvement Association calculated for the opposition of a world; hence, when the opposition, whether from without or from within, comes, it brings no disappointment. Those who have become members and joined the fold of this movement should realize that the command is to go forward, looking not to the right nor to the left, but make one great, and grand, and noble march toward the goal of African redemption.

Brave men have always held their own against opposition of every kind; brave men have always carved their way from slavery into liberty; brave men have laid the corner-stones of nations and empires in the past; brave men, and brave men alone, will change the political forces of the twentieth century, making a new world for the accommodation of the people who love liberty, who desire freedom, who desire human rights. No other organization besides the Universal Negro Improvement Association has ever made a fight for nationhood; no other organization has ever aroused the interest of the world, part sympathetic and part obstructive, as the Universal Negro Improvement Association. The liberal minds see right and justice in the program of this great organization; the selfish, unsympathetic see in it a menace that will interfere with their privileged capitalistic rights. But what do we care? It is not for the satisfaction of the world we fight; it is for the satisfaction of ourselves. Hence, we move on, caring not what others say or others do—our one purpose, our one object, is the planting of the colors of the Red, the Black and the Green as the African standard that shall give to us a country, a nation of our own.





# INDIA TO EMBARK ON NAVY BUILDING for the Honorable Marcus Garvey as

### British Make Concession with Small Beginning—First Sea Force Since 1830

DELHI, Feb. 1.-The Royal Indian Navy, the first combatant force the nation has had since 1830, now seems assured, in fact all that is needed is the sanction of the British king, and loved imprisoned leader. For the present it has been decided to reconstruct the Royal Indian Marine as the nucleus of the future navy, which is to be developed by the Indians themselves. According to the present plans, the peace time functions of the new nave will be: Training of personnel for service in war, the services required by Ocean and the Persian Gulf, the organization of naval defenses at ports under the control of the Indian government, survey work in the Indian Ocean and marine transport work for the government of India.

The announcement that India wa to have a navy came at the opening ession of the new Council of State yesterday. In the course of his speech the Viceroy announced that the government had decided on steps to enable India to provide for her own naval defense. His statement brought prolonged applause and when he declared that the new navy would be permitted to fly the white ensign even the British members of the House, who alone knew the full significance of the decision, were surprised, and cheers filled the chamber. The Vice-roy then declared that it was the inention of the government that India should make her navy worth while and that everything would be done to make the way easy in the first years of the new move.

He stressed the point that it was the desire of the government that Indians man the vessels and with that point in view emphasized that every commissioned post in the navy would be open to the Indians who would qualify for them. He urged that the young men of the nation who have a bent for sea life should becom interested in the navy and that the government would give them the same opportunity as afforded the youths of

Move Seen as Aid to Nation At present there are about fifty ves-sels, large and small, in the Royal Indian Marine, the largest being the Dufferin, 8,260 tons. All are manned by British officers, most of whom have received their training on the Conway or the Worcester. The strength of the commissioned officers is close to 150. The Indian Marine has but one dockyard now, at Bombay, as the one at Calcutta has been closed for

The name of the service was changed in 1686 to that of the Bombay Marine, a name which endured unti 1830. In the intervening years the small fleet had taken active part in many battles and shared in the taking of Chandernagore from the French in 1744. They were active, too, in the Mahratta war, 1774, and at the capture of Trincomalee and Pondicherry in later years. The Bombay Marine ships went far from their own waters in 1801 to assist Sir Ralph Abercromby's Egyptian expedition. In 1810 Bombay vessels were present at the capture of

Mauritius. The Bombay Marine became the Royal Indian Navy in 1930, although administered by the Bombay Presi-dency. Under its new title it shared in the China War of 1840-42, the New Zealand campaign of 1848-49, the sec-ond Burma War, the Indian Mutiny and the China War of 1860, In 1863 the navy again became the Bombay Ma-rine, the East Indian Company's governing power having disappeared from India. In 1877, on its transfer from the Bombay Presidency to the Government of India, it was renamed H. M. Indian Marine. The present style, Royal Indian Ma-

rine, dates from 1892. Since that time Indian ships have taken part in the South African War of 1899-1902, the rebellion, 1900, and in the Great

### A PEN PICTURE OF THE PEOPLE OF CUBA

They Have No Middle Class, Races Much Mixed and Almost Nó Color Line Exists-Modern and Primitive

Cristo lies among the foothills of

the mountains that sweep about Santiago de Cuba. It is at an elevation of close to a thousand feet, some ten miles inland from the coast. It has about 5,000 inhabitants, of whom nearly 70 percent are of African mixture. In a hanhazard sort of way it serve as a summer resort for the Santia gans, who have cottages where the send their families for the hot sum-mer months, say George Biddle and Jane Bale in Scribner's Magazine. The village is built along the railroad track and straggles in either direction up and down the carretera. There are blue, pink, with royal palms, hibiscuhedges and crotons; a few thatched huts, such as one sees in the country the walls made of strips of palm bark with goats, chickens and naked children wandering in and out.

It is all rather nondescript and un tidy. No restaurants, no hotels and no sewer or water systems. Flocks of carrion vultures hover over the muddy The aguador, or water carrier carts water with a burro more or less daily and sells ten gallons for a real The Chinese peddle baskets of vegetables swung from a pole, and almos any one peddles chickens, pigeons eggs, fruit and milk.

The village is tawdry rather than picturesque, and the country about it is as beautiful as a page from the Old Testament. There are a hundred such villages in Cuba and thousands more like it anywhere in Spanish America. Life in such a village gives a cros


section of Spanish-American civilization. Its drama and excitement lie in its utter anomaly. There is always Maxfield Parrish background of melo dramatic beauty. The standard of civilization is the standard of the movies of Sozodont advertisements, of Ford cars. The songs which the girls sing in the evening first made their appear ance in Broadway or in a Madrid They are transformed into something a little Spanish or a little Negro.

There are two outstanding facts bout the civilization of Cuba and probably of a great section of Spanish America which make that civilization exciting as a background as well as a social experiment. There is almost no middle class and there is almost no color line. Years ago in Mexico I noticed the same conditions. There was the man who wore a derby hat and shoes and stockings; and ther was the pelado or peon who wore sandals, and a wide sombrero, ate jerked meat and tortillas and carried a ma-

chete.

The one was probably wealthy and had been educated in New York or Paris; the other could neither read nor write and lived like an Indian. In Cuba, as in Mexico, there is tiny fraction of the population which boasts of having Spanish blood. Thirty percent of the population is Negro and perhaps 90 percent has some Negro or Indian blood. The mixture shows every shade between black and white; sometimes the Negro sometimes the European or Indian type dominates. But there is little evidence of fusion into a new racia

The color line that exists is less marked than the social line dividing West from East Sixty-eighth street.

### Soviet Divorce for \$2; Weddings Last 4 Years

LENINGRAD, Russia, Feb. 25 (AP). -The government has just published statistics which show that the average duration of marriages in Leningrad is only four years, there being 237 diriages. This condition is explained by the ease and small expense with which divorces can be obtained under the new Soviet civil code, the only requirement being the expressed desire of either party that the marriage con-

tract be annulled. A divorce costs only \$2. In 1925 there were 13.8 marriages for every 1,000 of Leningrad's population. In 1914 the figure was 6.4.
