# Hon. Marcus Garvey Eloquently States The Case For The Negro

The following is an extract from a speech delivered by Hon. Marcus Garvey, founder and President-General of the Universal Negro Improvement Association, at Liberty Hall, New York, on Sunday, March 16, 1924:

The Negro race is divided into two groups, the industrious and adventurous and the lazy and dependent. The industrious and adventurous believe that whatsoever others have done they can do. The Universal Negro Improvement Association belongs to this group, and so you find us working, six million strong, to the goal of an independent nationality. Who will not help? Only the mean and despicable, "who never to himself hath said this is my own, my native land." Africa is the legitimate, moral and righteous home of all Negroes, and now that the time is coming for all to assemble under their own vine and fig tree we feel it our duty to arouse every Negro to a consciousness of himself.

White and black will learn to respect each other when they cease to be active competitors in the same countries for the same things in politics and society. Let them have countries of their own, wherein to aspire and climb without rancor.

We want an atmosphere all our own. We would like to govern and rule ourselves and not be encumbered and restrained. We feel now just as the white race would feel if they were governed and ruled by the Chinese. If we live in our own districts, let us rule and govern those districts. If we have a majority in our communities, let us run those communities. We form a majority in Africa, and we should naturally govern ourselves there. No man can govern another's house as well as himself. Let us have fair play. Let us have justice. This is the appeal we make to white America.

We Negroes are not asking the white man to turn Europe and America over to us. We are not asking the Asiatic to turn Asia over for the accommodation of the blacks. But we are asking a just and righteous world to restore Africa to her scattered and abused children. (Applause).

We believe in justice and human love. If our rights are to be respected, then, we, too, must respect the rights of all mankind; hence, we are ever ready and willing to yield to the white man the things that are his, and we feel that he, too, when his conscience is touched, will yield to us the things that are ours. (Applause).

We should like to see a peaceful, prosperous and progressive white race in America and Europe; a peaceful, prosperous and progressive yellow race in Asia, and, in like manner, we want, and we demand, a peaceful, prosperous and progressive black race in Africa. (Applause). Is that asking too much? Surely not. Humanity, without any immediate human hope of racial oneness, has drifted apart, and is now divided into separate and distinct groups, each with its own ideals and aspirations. Thus, we cannot expect any one race to hold a monopoly of creation and be able to keep the rest satisfied.

And so, to you Negroes, we are making a direct racial appeal. The hour has come for the Universal Negro Improvement Association to organize and bring into one solid whole the 400,000,000 Negroes of the wold. (Applause). We started out to organize the sentiment of the Negro race throughout the world. All of you who have been identified with the association know its history. Five years ago we started in New York with 13 men and 13 women who formed the first New York organization. Today we have 1,000 branches of the Universal Negro Improvement Association organized throughout the United States of America, throughout Canada, throughout South America, throughout Central America, throughout the West Indies, throughout Asia, throughout Europe and throughout Africa.

Today this organization represents an active membership of 6,000,000 Negroes. (Applause) What are we fighting for? We are fighting for the creating of a nation—of a government of our own. (Applause). We believe it was right for the great white man to rule himself. If it is great for the rising yellow man of Asia to rule himself, it is also right for the black man to rule himself. (Applause).

And as I conclude my subject in another ten minutes, I am going to ask those of you who believe that the Negro race should help itself, those of you who believe that the Negro should represent a nationality, a government or a nation of its own, I am going to ask you to contribute as liberally as you can to the work of this organization.

"The hour has struck for universal activity among the Negro peoples of the world. It is for them now to concentrate on the building up of a great industry of their own. It is of no use for Negroes to continue to depend on the good graces of other races, because we are living in a world of selfish races—each striving

We feel it necessary to point out in detail just what this fund will do and let you see that you ought to support it liberally. The following major items must be vigorously put into opera-

We are trying to add One Million new members to the U. N. I. A. In order to reach One Million people from headquarters, we will have to spend approximately ten cents for each person, which will mean Ten Thousand (\$10,000) dollars. Now every one is anxious to see the membership increased, and this amount of money must be spent to make the necessary step for the increase.

2. We desire to create a machine which will put in motion a general memorialization of every State Legislature, with a view of getting it to recognize the program of the U. N. I. A. as the best means of solving the race problem. To do this effectively, we will have to spend in each State about Three Thousand (\$3,000) dollars for clerical work, and transportation of individuals connected with it. You can readily see, therefore, the need which faces us in this particular direction.

3. We have started to fight the unjust decision handed down by the court in Belize, involving the bequest of One Hundred Thousand (\$100,000) dollars, left by Mr. Morter for the U. N. I. A. for the furtherance of its African program. It is our opinion that this bequest will eventually come to the U. N. I. A. as intended by the late Sir Isiah Morter, in his last will and testament.

4. We are organizing and directing the political strength of the Negro for the racial good of all. In this, instead of acquiring money from the politician, the organization always finds it necessary to spend money to preserve the manhood rights

We have mentioned these things to draw your attention to the mportance of them. There is no person within the U. N. I. A. who could not make a contribution toward this fund. If a greater and more powerful U. N. I. A. is to exist, it will come only through continued support of a zealous nature. Every one should contribute at least Twenty-five (\$25) dollars, even if it must be done on a weekly or monthly basis. Let us demonstrate the greatness of the U. N. I. A. by doing the things which we now suggest.

We have passed the acid tests of all the great and dangerous critics, and have now evolved to the point where only our own inactivity, laziness or unwillingness to carry on will spell our failure. We are fully conscious of your divisional responsibilities, but

you must remember that the Divisions cannot become greater than the Parent Body. As the Federal Government is supreme in the body politic of the United States, so every member of the U. N. I. A. should regard the Parent Body as the supreme body, guiding and controlling the Divisions, and any failure to carry out Parent Body

plans spells the failure of the Division. We are not taxing you, by we are earnestly appealing to your sense of your responsibility touching the race and the organization.

We trust that each one will regard this as sacred and dutiful and will not hesitate from this day to send in his or her contribution and receive certificates of honor, duly signed by our heroic leader, the Hon. MARCUS GARVEY.



## **SURPLUS POPULATION** PRESENTS PROBLEM

**Emigration and Colonization** Problems Threaten Peace of Next Meeting of the League, given an adequate outlet. with Italy and Japan Wielding the Big Stick

Geneva. June 22 .- In the prepara tion by the League of Nations of its nternational economic conference for 1927 a bitter fight is scheduled on the question of emigration, or, as it is suphemistically termed for the purpose of not frightening any one, movements l population. While European and league experts

now recognize that emigration consti-tutes one of the most important factors in worldwide economic reconstruction and especially in that of Europe-it is by no means certain that they will he economic conference.

Emigration is generally recognized to be a matter of domestic legislation and as a consequence it is certain that at least all of those countries which have restracted emigration will oppose in the extreme degree its being treated as an international question.

### Japan a Surprise

One of the surprises of the preliminary meeting of experts for preparing the conference's agenda was the fact that Japan did not insist upon the On the other hand, Italy did and with an insistence that made it necessary for the experts at least to take the matter under temporary consideration.

The compromise which was arrived at was that a thorough investigation should be made into the whole subject of movements of population—this meaning both emigration and colonization—thus obtained the league will decide later whether the question can actually come before the conference. 
