United Race Determined to Usher In New Era of Liberty

Fellow-Men of the Negro Race, Greeting:

The world is undergoing a state of reorganization wherein each and every group of the great human family seeks an expression of its own will. The keenness of the age brings out a rivalry among races and nations that makes it possible for only those who are strongly organized and well prepared to survive the eternal conflict. It is in such a competition that the Negro is called upon at this time to play his part. We must, as a people, decide for ourselves now whether we shall go forward or backward in the competitive program of races and nations. Once upon a time our race indulged in the security of human charity and sympathy, but today the world is void of these attributes, and we are forced either to do for ourselves or die by being relegated to the scrap heap of humanity. The space accommodation for races and nations is becoming so narrow and circumscribed as to suggest that in a short while only the fittest of the great human groups will survive, the weaker ones having, perforce, to die or move on to make room for those who are strong enough to hold their own.

The calamity of extermination faces the Negro, and it is because of that that the Universal Negro Improvement Association is organizing the world over so that through a united course we can so settle ourselves as to insure permanent existence. We cry out for a united Africa, for a liberated country. This sentiment has made the circuit of the world, but still there are millions who have not yet made up their minds to join in the holy crusade. It is for them that those of us who make up the Universal Negro Improvement Association labor, because we who have caught the vision cannot have it realized without the assistance of those who suffer with us, because they are of our kind. Hence, our effort is to convert them to the way of seeing things as they are, and realizing that it is only through united effort on the part

of all Negroes that we can truly free ourselves and liberate our country.

Many have thought us crazy and unreasonable in declaring for "Africa for the Africans" at home and abroad, but the principle of an independent African nationality for Negroes is not one that has been originated by the Negro himself, but only copied from the other races in their raising the cry of "Asia for the Asiatics," "Europe for the Europeans," "America for the Americans." The Negro seeks liberty in the truest sense and fullest meaning. The world must know that the son of Africa is no longer disposed to be crushed, ignored and relegated to the back heap of human society. He wants a place in the forefront and is determined to be heard. The world may wonder at this change in the race's attitude, but what else can the world expect? Even though our fathers slept for centuries, we of this day do not make up our minds to indulge in the slumber of the ages that would keep us as serfs, peons and slaves. We have heard the rattling cry of liberty, the timbrel sound of democracy, for which all present-day races and nations are working with the fullest hope and satisfaction that they shall enjoy without molestation. The sons and daughters of Africa are too many to allow themselves to be deprived of these valuable essentials to human happiness, human progress and human salvation. We feel as a people that the privileges and opportunities enjoyed by others should also be enjoyed by us, in that Nature made us heirs in common to this glorious Creation in which we find ourselves and in which we know no other master but the Creator. In all things physical we are determined to master our own destiny and direct our own fate. In the things that are spiritual, we leave ourselves entirely to the will of God, but in the new philosophy we feel that if we must rise to heights of material glory we must accomplish that only through our own physical endeavors and in that direction four hundred million Negroes are now bent under the leadership of the Universal Negro Improvement Association. 

COLOMBIA NEWSPAPER REPRINTS SILLY STORY FROM U.S. HATE SHEET

By ERNEST E. MAIR

In the newspaper "Correo del Cauca," published in Colombia, issue of August 28, appears the following

"NEGRO AFFAIRS"

"The Negroes of the United States are a clever lot of darkeys. They have the habit of giving to their children some names that fit like an oversize garment. They have the most complete collection of celebrated names to be found anywhere. Whenever a new Negro baby is to be baptized they slap on to him some illus-trious name without even knowing who the person was that first made that name famous. And as the members of that element are frequently mixed up in affairs of a questionable nature the results are at times extremely amusing.

"For instance, some time ago in city in Florida, Benjamin Franklin received a jail sentence for chicken-stealing and Thomas Jefferson was fined for beating up his wife. Before a criminal court George Washington was haled for arson while Sarah Bernhardt was convicted of stealing a basket of vegetables. But these cases were mere trifles compared with those of Victor Hugo and Shakespeare, who were awarded each a month in prison for stealing a pig."

Now it doesn't take any great amount of skill to discover the source of the above tit-bit. Even without having seen the same thing in Southern newspaper this writer would have recognized it for what it wasproduct of American prejudice. peculiar thing about it all is that the paper which carries this scurvy paper which carries this scurvy slander of black Americans has often commonited favorably on the achieve nents of the Negro in the United States. I am informed by our Spanish editor that some of his best material has come from the editor this solf-same Colombian paper.

Indifference To Insult The best construction we can put upon it is that it was the work of some minor employee on the staff of "Correo del Cauca." Colombia is well known for her liberal attitude toward her own citizens of color, of whom there are a goodly quantity; many of whom hold enviable positions in poli-tics, agriculture and commerce. But it is a familiar paradox to the colored traveller that where the Negro has least resistance to his progress he develops most indifference to racial insults of this type. In the British Colonies of the New World, for instance, where Negroes hold most of the positions of eminence, you will hear colored children singing the insulting "coon" songs of our own South with never a thought of their being possibly applied to themselves. Thus may we explain the fact that race-consciousness makes most conis greatest, and least headway where conditions are favorable to individual Negro progress. It is no alarmist view to take that the (supposedly) white Latins of Central and South America and the West Indies are be ing more or less slowly, but none the less surely, won over by American anti-Negro propaganda to the same low opinion of their darker brethren as obtains in this most civilized (sic) of countries. perial unity was welded.

As the imperial conference meets in 1926 the issues of war no longer occupy the front-position on the stage, but the issues of peace are no less vital to the empire. No doubt the question of imperial defense will again come forward; Britain believes in keeping its powder dry. But for the momen trade with the empire—Stanley Bald-win hides his tariff schemes under the camouflage of Dominion preference-is uppermost, and the historian of the imperial conference of this year may chronicle the fact that in 1926 there was inaugurated an Imperial General Trade Staff in London as quietly as the war staff was efficiently set up in 1909, and it may be surmised that Mr. Baldwin's ddress to his fellow Prime Ministers will urge the forma-

tion of a homogenous organization for miperial trade just as Mr. Asquith urged his defense scheme in the year 1909.

The part they played in the great war won for the Dominions the right of consultation in empire affairs. The have gone a step further and exercised the right of appointing their own diplo-States. The relations of Canada and the United States are intimate and unique. Moreover, the sight of what the Manchester Guardian calls "street. fuls of British Ambassadors' accred ited to every foreign capital might be more mirth provoking than impressive. Ibn Saud Will Spare

Mahomet's Tomb in Medina JERUSALEM, Oct. 16 .- Though the Wahabi tribesmen usually oppose the construction of tombs of modern architecture, ordaining that they should not be raised more than two feet above the ground, the authorities of the kingdom of Hedjaz officially contradet reports that the Wahabi king, Ibn Saud, intends to pull down the tomb of the

prophet Mahomet in Medina.

When Ibn Saud occupied the Hedjaz, the Wahabis actually destroyed several tombs of saints, and rumor since then has been rife that they might even demolish the prophet's tomb. Strict measures are now reported to have been taken by Ibn Saud to protect such memorial structures in the Hedjaz, according to reports from his representatives in Egypt.
