Hon. Marcus Garvey Makes Earnest Appeal to Members to Support the Parent Body to the Utmost of Their Resources; Money and Unity Will Defeat the Enemy

Fellow-Men of the Negro Race, Greeting:

I desire to make a special appeal to you, the members of the Universal Negro Improvement Association, to rally, to the limit of your resources, to the support of our grand and glorious organization. You have done well in the past, but only by continued sacrifice and self-denial can we hope to come safely through the terrible ordeal which confronts us today.

The enemy is now endeavoring to do his worst, thinking that the present is the opportune time to strike a body blow at the cause we love, and to the prosecution of which we have dedicated our lives. With shame and sorrow I note the efforts of selfish and traitorous men in New York to undermine the growth and sully the good name of the organization we love. By a second campaign of slander, by astounding and barefaced misrepresentations, they are seeking to disrupt our movement, if they cannot make it serve their selfish, greedy aims. But this campaign, like the first launched shortly after my incarceration, is bound to fail when met by a united membership, loyal and true. It is money, such as Judas Iscariot accepted, which is enabling the traitors to maintain their onslaught on this movement of ours; and it is with the strength that money can summon that you will be able to successfully repel them.

Be on guard. Stand four-square to all the winds that blow. Give now, and postpone complaining for a later date. My enthusiasm for the fight for Africa's redemption is, as you know, unalterable. I still have

in a free and redeemed Africa leading mankind up new and more gloricus heights. I firmly believe we shall give to the world a civilization greater than any it has ever known.

But we cannot hope to accomplish anything in the near or distant future unless our world organization is held intact—an organization built up through years of toil and blood and sweat. We must have our fingers on the pulse of millions of Negroes the world over. We must have a Parent Body, functioning one hundred per cent., guiding and controlling our hundreds of branches, executing and furthering the program mapped out.

And so it becomes the sacred duty of each and every member of the Universal Negro Improvement Association, the duty of every branch of this great movement, to see that funds are sent regularly to New York headquarters. Pay your dues and assessment tax. Obey all the rules for financial aid as laid down in the Constitution, and, in addition, do not fail to support the Rehabilitation and Expansion Fund. Give tithe of all you possess so that the only hope of ultimate salvation for the Negro may be maintained.

During the late war the powerful white governments called upon the people, practically compelled the people, to sacrifice money and treasure—to give until it hurt. You, too, answered those appeals. Now you are called upon to give, plainly unto yourselves, so that your existence on the face of the earth may not be imperilled.

Give until it hurts. This is my earnest appeal to you.

Armistice Day, November 11

November 11, 1926. The eighth anniversary of Armistice Day, What a wealth of memories must it conjure up in the minds of millions!

Eight years ago, at 11 a. m., London time, the world went into a de-Blirium of joy. The Great War was at an end. On the pattle-fronts guns eased to boom; grimy hands fished out greasy photographs of loved ones, and lovingly caressed them. Away from the strife area guns began to boom, telling thankful communities that the mad horrors of the bloodiest conflict were ended. In town and village, city and hamlet, men ceased from their labors-all except the gunner, the flag-seller and the pickpocket. From factory and cottage, loft building and basement, men, women and children rushed into the streets, as if, by sniffing the air of peace, to verify the glad tidings. Some fell on their knees and gave praise to God; more yelled in sheer hysteria; the many sought tavern and "pub," saloon and "speak-easy," to drink "Victory" drink. All were caught in a whirlpool of excitement and indulged their animal spirits.

The Brotherhood of Man, the Fatherhood of Gc4; seemed to be in evidence. Capitalist and laborer, bishop and wine-bibber, street gamin and society maiden, were in the grip of one common urge. No barrier of estation or heritage arose to mar the common festival. Joy was unconfined, and Christian feeling. They locked arms, the select and the soiled, and sang and shouted and capered and chortled, all brothers and sisters, with a common purpose, with One Aim, One God, One Destiny. It was a beautiful thing to behold. . . .

The writer happened to be in London on that eventful day, and in khaki. It was a typical November day, A sickly rain was falling. A pall of near-fog hung low over the city. With the rest I rushed outdoors as gunners gave the signal which all were awaiting. As I reached the street a bovy of fair typists from a neighboring office bore down and smothered me with kisses. Yes, the interference was Nordic. Ever so comme il faut I received the embraces, now turning one cheek, then the other. Nor were my lips idle. Armistice Day had come to cheer.

When the tumult within had subsided, I tried to take in the scene around me. Packed gloriously in coal trucks and brandishing flags, staid business men and rollicking maidens rolled past. Automobiles designed to carry four, five or six were freighted with a score.. Taxis, were comandeered by the joymakers, their drivers' dreams of brisk business tem porarily shattered. Banks closed their doors, and jewelry shops, so looting did not become part of the festivities. Only the "pubs" kept open. And nobly they saved the day. For when Lunnon's November morn had done its deadly work; when spirits flagged, and arms hung limp, and voices grew hoarse, brave reinforcements sallied forth into the streets, reeling but raucous, to put pep into the damp revels.

Eight years have passed since this enthralling scene was enacted and with them the brotherhood manifestations. One may have guessed they would, for when a people gives thanks to God by getting drunk, forgetting God is only one parasang away. November, 1926, finds the nations of the world still drunk, still consumed by deceit and intrigue, still planning and plotting war, and a war more cruel than that which closed in 1918. Europe is still a boiling volcano which at any moment may break into eruption. The weak are still oppressed and ground down. The reign of Righteousness is still a hollow hope.

"Might is Right," said the Teuton in those dark days. "God is Right," said Anglo-Saxon and Gaul, "and He will prevail." The battle was a drawn one. God, looking down on the warring, godless hosts, must have observed a strict neutrality. Today, the weak are still ground down. The oppressor still fashions his own doom. Vaunted white civilization, which has enthroned Expediency, is still in peril. Who doubts that God is just?

On Thursday, November 11, pious prayers will ascend to heaven. Men, pious and otherwise, will murmur thanks that "Peace still reigns on the earth." But God is not mocked.

For how can it be said that peace reigns, well may the black man ask, when everywhere war is being waged against him. Driven from pillar to post in East and West, lashed with the cruel whip of economic and physical enslavement in his own Africa, he is the sorry victim of the hate, greed and prejudice of these very Armistice Day celebrants. 

POWERS SEEK TO END DISPUTE OVER TANGIER

France and Spain to Be Joined By Britain and Italy in Negotiations

LONDON, Nov. 4.-That the thorny question of the status of Tangler is at last on the high road toward settlement is foreshadowed by a statement from an unimpeachable source here

It is announced that the negotiations regarding Tangier have advanced so far that it has been possible for France to send an official invitation to Madrid asking the Spanish Government to participate in direct conversations with French representatives. This invita-tion has been accepted by the Spanish Covernment It has been arranged urthermore that when Paris Madrid have reached an agreement on essential points regarding Tangier the British and Italian Governments will Join the French and the Spanish in urther conversations.

The internationalized status of Tangier, it will be remembered, has been productive of acute differences among the nationals of the various European countries domiciled there which led erious was Spain's demand that Tangier be adjudiented to her, which she threatened to make an issue at the success of that momentous gathering. That the animosity engendered by various Tangier incidents has so blown over as to allow the rival nations to here as a good omen for the ultimate mitsfactory settlement of the tangled affairs of the strategic North African sea port.

75 NET INCOMES ABOVE A MULLION

Three Taxpayers Report More Than \$5,000,000-Bulk Between One and Two Thousand Dollars-Untaxed Securities, \$3,729,205,974

WASHINGTON, Nov. 1 (A. P.) .-There were 75 persons in the United States with net incomes of more than \$1,000,000 in 1924, it was shown in in come tax statistics for that year made public today by the Treasury.

Taxpayers, however, with net inomes between \$1,000 and \$2,000 constituted the largest portion of the 7,-369,788 individuals who filed returns that year, numbering 2,413,881 or 32.75 per cent of the total.

The brunt of the \$704,265,390 in-dividual income tax paid that year was porne by the class of taxpayers with incomes between \$50,000 and \$100,000, who paid \$136,636,004 in taxes or 19.40

per cent of the total.

The 75 millionaires reported total net incomes of \$155,974,475, and paid \$47,-207,203 taxes, or 6.70 per cent of the total return. Of these 3 reported net incomes of more than \$5,000,000; 3 between \$4,000,000 and \$5,000,000; 4 be tween \$3,000,000 and \$4,000,000 and J5 between \$2,000,000 and \$3,000,000.

Those filing returns in 1924 com prised 6.56 per cent of the population and reported net incomes of \$25,656, 155,454. The number of individual tax payers was cut by more than 2,500,000 that year as a result of the increase in exemptions allowed by Congress in the new revenue law.

For the first time statistics were obtained on the amount of money in vested in tax exempt securities, the report showing that it totaled \$3,729,-205,734, while \$1,626,251,401 was invested in partially tax exempt securi-ties, the interest from the former amounting to \$165,609,720 and the latter \$373,012,000. The greater portion of tax exempt securities consisted of State and local bonds in which \$2,552,-645.502 was invested.

Of the taxable income reported in 1924 more was derived from personal industry, including \$13,617,000,000 re ceived from salaries and wages and \$8,-079,000,000 from business, trade and eommerce. It was shown that \$30,637,000 was

saved taxpayers during that year as result of the 25 per cent credit alowed for the first time on the "earned

The District of Columbia and Nevada had the largest percentage of population filing returns, with 15.98 and 13.78 per cent respectively. California was third with 13.06 per cent Mississippi had the lowest percentage, only 1.52 per cent.

New York individual taxpayers paid the largest proportion of the income levy with a total of \$236,774,567, or 33.62 per cent, and Pennsylvania was second with a percentage of 11.06 Nevada and New Mexico paid the lowest proportions of the total income tax with a percentage of .03 each.

The per capita net income reported for the year was \$228.33 and the per capita income tax was \$6.27.
