Negroes Must Discard the Propaganda of Alien Races and Promote a Racial Character Of Their Own

Fellow Men of the Negro Race, Greeting:

It is gratifying to see and realize how wonderfully well our people are throwing off the psychology of alien races and promoting a racial character of their own.

For quite a long while the members of other races tried to enslave us by a false psychology and a vicious propaganda. They tried to make us see life and all things from their point of view, and they succeeded to the extent that they nearly made permanent slaves of all of us; but, fortunately, you cannot "fool all of the people all of the time," because to us is born in this age a new type of men who are determined to cast off the psychology and propaganda of the other fellow and husband that of their own.

The great white man has succeeded in subduing the world by forcing everybody to think his way, from his God to his fireside. He has given to the world, from the Bible to his yellow newspaper sheet, a literature that establishes his right and sovereignty to the disadvantage of the rest of the human race.

The white man's propaganda has made him the master of the world, and all those who have come in contact with it and accepted it have become his slaves.

The Universal Negro Improvement Association is calling upon the 400,000,000 members of our race to discard the psychology and propaganda of all other peoples and to advance our own. The white man taught that the best of the world was intended for him, and we now teach that all the beauties of creation are the black man's, and he is heir to all that God has given to man.

"A White World"

The white man sees a white world and propagates his doctrines accordingly. The black man now sees a black world and teaches that to his race of all generations.

Above the noise and shout of the world there should be one ringing cry, that of "Africa for the Africans," at home and abroad. Then we should also insist on seeing all things black to the exclusion of all other matter. So long as Englishmen are going to talk about England and Frenchmen of France and white Americans of America, then there is nothing left for us to do but think and talk of black Africa, the preaching of the Christian missionary notwithstanding.

We must meet propaganda with propaganda and not let up until those who lead in the selfishness of race demonstrate the real brotherhood of man that they have been telling the world about for nearly 2,000 years.

The Negro is now accepting the religion of the real Christ, the Christ of Love, Justice and Mercy. The Negro wants no more of the white man's religion as it applies to his race, for it is a lie and a farce; it is propaganda pure and simple to make fools of a race and rob the precious world, the gift of God to man, and make of it the exclusive home of pleasure, prosperity and happiness for those who have enough intelligence to realize that God made them masters of their fate and architects of their own destinies.

The Negro's love for Christ and the Christian religion is beyond question, but we simply refuse any longer to accept the interpretation of the white man on those fundamentals that seek to elevate or establish the rights of man. The white leader has failed to impress the world of today with his honesty of purpose. He is only a propagandist, and the black race has had enough of his propaganda and wants no more of it.



And the punishment did not fit the "crime." Marcus Garvey, con victed on one count, was sentenced to the maximum penalty, five years' nent, and mulcted in the costs of the trial, which will be in the vicinity of \$10,000. He went to Atlanta penitentiary on February 9, 192 sent to the Federal prison he was held a prisoner in the Tombs, Nev York, for three months. Who is there who can honestly say that he has not been punished enough? A week's imprisonment is a severe punishment for any man accustomed to liberty and uninured to confinment Nineteen months is a nerve-racking trial for the most hardened criminal,

We learn that nearly a year ago, when the President of the United States had to pass upon an application for the release of Marcus Garvey the papers were marked with the laconic word, "Premature." And citizens of America, at least six millions in number, respectfully submit that death of Christ, humility and self-

But, it appears, that the punishment to be meted out to Marcus Garey, the man loved and revered and respected by more Negroes in the world today than any other man, white or black, in or out of America, enormous fine. He is to be deported, we are told. All lovers of liberty and justice for the Negro fervently hope that this man will not be sent powers. But, with deportation in the distance, the punishment, even i it be more spiritual than otherwise, is increased tenfold. If Marcus Gar vey had been released from Atlanta one week after his imprisonment and leported, his punishment would have been drastic. There are certain rights denied a deportee in several countries, to say nothing of the ignominy of the thing itself.

SOME RARE FINDS IN EGYPTIAN TOMB

Harvard Investigator Uncovers Treasures of Fourth Dynasty

CAIRO, Nov. 10.-Dr. George Reisner, assistant professor of Egyptology of Harvard University, has issued a report describing the work he has done on the tomb of Queen Netewife of Senefro, first sovereign of the fourth dynasty. The report said that identification of the tomb is based on two inscriptions in gold hieroglyphics on the back of a carrying chair.

Dr. Reisner found evidence that Netepheres died some time after Cheops came to the throno and was buried at Dashur, on the west of the Nile and directly south of the great pyramids. The tomb was rifled by thieves, and when the violation was discovered Cheops's secretary trans-ferred the body to a new tomb at the entrance of the pyramid Ghiza. This a vertical shaft cut 100 feet through the limestone, with the chamsmashed.

The discoveries included a bed and three chairs, still intact; fifty implements and tools, six of which are solid gold, fifteen copper and the others flint; a dozen wooden panels with inlaid floral designs in faience, framed in gold; household vessels, including three gold cups, a copper basin, a ewer, twenty-eight alabaster vessels and five boxes of linen, almost entirely disintegrated.

Many of the vessels found represent the traditional types of the third dynasty. Perhaps the most impressive discovery was a gold cased jewel box the Queen's name and containing twenty silver anklets, graduated to fit the leg upward. Each anklet is ornamental with four con-ventionalized dragon flies inlaid with calachite, lapis lazuli and cornelian.

Dr. Reisner has now begun to re-move the canopy and sarcophagus with the palens bearing the name of Senefro. The canopy's frame-work is an astonishing piece of work. All the tenons and mortices are sheathed with copper. It has copper attachments for curtains or doors. sacrophagus wil probably be opened in
