

TON, FRED A. TOOTE, Acting President-General, in h splendid address in Liberty Hall, New York, Sunday eve-February 5, made the following extraordinary statement:

"You who are here tonight are all white folks, black as you are. That sounds paradoxical, but it is true. The white man's culture and influence is upon you, you are saturated with it, and in spite of vourselves you are white-you see white and think white all too frequently.

"And, my friends, that is why we have opened this University in Claremont, Virginia, in order that we might turn the whiteness out of our souls and embrace that culture, that education that will lift us from degradation up to the highest heights of civilization. It can be done, and it must be done,"







He said the Philippines virthe exception of a few privileges, such as the right to trial by, jury and the selection of supreme governing officials. Standards of living, he said would undoubtedly drop if the United States let the islands go free. He believed that if a plebiscite is held, as he proposed, the people would vote to continue with the United States rather than be independent.
