Our Programme

By HON. MARCUS GARVEY

Founder and President-General of the Universal Negro Improvement Association

The weekly message of the Hon. Marcus Garvey, President-General of the Universal Negro Improvement Association, not having reached the office of the Negro World up to the time of going to press, the following excerpt from a remarkable address delivered by the famous leader at Liberty Hall, New York City, on November 25, 1922, is published for the careful consideration of readers the world over. The full text of this speech appears in the second volume of "Philosophy and Opinions of Marcus Garvey," or "Africa for the Africans," pages 93-100:

Removing the Misunderstanding

"In advocating the principles of this Association we find we have been very much misunderstood and very much misrepresented by men from within our own race, as well as others from without. Any reform movement that seeks to bring about changes for the benefit of humanity is bound to be misrepresented by those who have always taken it upon themselves to administer to and lead the unfortunate, and to direct those who may be placed under temporary disadvantages. It has been so in all other movements whether social or political; hence, those of us in the Universal Negro Improvement Association who lead do not feel in any way embarrassed about this misrepresentation, about this misunderstanding as far as the Aims and Objects of the Universal Negro Improvement Association go. But those who probably would have taken kindly notice of this great movement have been led to believe that this movement seeks, not to develop the good within the race, but to give expression to that which is most destructive and most harmful to society and to government.

"I desire to remove the misunderstanding that has been created in the minds of millions of peoples throughout the world in their relationship to the organization. The Universal Negro Improvement Association stands for the Bigger Brotherhood; the Universal Negro Improvement Association stands for human rights, not only for Negroes, but for all races. The Universal Negro Improvement Association believes in the rights of not only the black race, but the white race, the yellow race and the brown race. The Universal Negro Improvement Association believes that the white man has as much right to be considered, the yellow man has as much right to be considered, the brown man has as much right to be considered as well as the black man of Africa.

"In view of the fact that the black man of Africa has contributed as much to the world as the white man of Europe, and the brown man and yellow man of Asia, we of the Universal Negro Improvement Association demand that the white, yellow and brown races give to the black man his place in the civilization of the world. We ask for nothing more than the rights of 400,000,000 Negroes. We are not seeking, as I said before, to destroy or disrupt the society or the government of other races, but we are determined that 400,000,000 of us shall unite ourselves to free our motherland from the grasp of the invader. We of the Universal Negro Improvement Association are determined to unite 400,000,000 Negroes for their own industrial, political, social and religious emancipation. "We of the Universal Negro Improvement Association are determined to unite the 400,000,000 Negroes of the world to give expression to their own feeling; we are determined to unite the 400,000,000 Negroes of the world for the purpose of building a civilization of their form. And in that effort we desire to bring together the 15,000,000 of the United States, the 180,000,000 in Asia, the West Indies and Central and South America, and the 200,000,000 in Africa. We are looking toward political freedom on the continent of Africa, the land of our fathers."

Babylonian Tablet Tells Nuptial Compact

ITHACA, N. Y. -- The Babylonian husband -- 2400 B. C. variety -- ap-The peculiar construction of many words in our language is due, accord-ing to the Mentor, to the fact that parently insured himself against the nore serious domestic difficulties. In a collection of 220 Babylonian tablets given to Cornell University by H. I. Patten, of Chicago, is a marriage contract of the first dynasty drafted on an earthen cone in cuneiform char-acters, which sets forth that:

The document also names four per

ions who have been adopted as heir of Sinnaya, and says that 'house, field, orchard, office and furniture of every kind he has given to them." Eight witnesses signed the contract, which is dated "in the month of Azagga, the year in which Samsu-iluna, the king, made a brazen standing object deco rated with representations of moun tains and rivers.'

The collection comprises letters, re ceipts, bills of sale, inheritance divi-sions, mathematical calculations and public documents. Their legal terminology closely resembles that of modern times, and shows that many principles of law in vogue more than 4,000 years ago are still in use.

The university has had the earther manuscripts preserved by an electric baking process, and plans to exhibit them, with translations, in the library. They date from the Ur dynasty, about 400 B. C., through the Neo-Babylonian dynasty, approximately 625 B. C. Mr. Patten purchased them in Bagdad.




