District New Hospital Is Interracial **Achievement**

Chattanooga Provides Equal Fa cilities for Colored Children In \$250,000 Infirmary for Cripples

CHATTANOOGA. Tenn. - The opening here a few days ago of the new \$250,000 hozpital for crippled children is regarded as a distinct in-terracial achievement in that the in-stitution provides exactly the same facilities for colored children as for white. Of the hundred beds in the hospital twelve have been definitely aside for the use of colored children, with the same equipment and conditions of admission as in the case of the others. They will be in the care of a colored nurse.






