Anarchy," Says Southern Interracial Commission

ATLANTA, Ga.-Through its director, Dr. Will W. Alexander, the Commission on Interracial Co-operation with a membership of a hundred Southern men and women, yesterday addressed to Governor Dovle E Carleton, the following telegram rel-ative to the recent lynching at Quincy,

Governor Doyle E. Carleton. . allahassee, Fla.:

"Distressed to note your progressive administration marred by another lynching, the third in Florida whole country. This act of anarchy a serious blow at Florida's good name and a reflection upon the whole South The honor of the state demands prompt apprehension and conviction of the perpetrators. However heinous the victim's crime, lynching can have no defense under a government of law. It's continuance stigmatizes our civilization and discredits our religious professions around the world."

In giving the telegram to the press Dr. Alexander said:

"This latest othreak of mob vio-"This latest otherak of mob vio-tence in Florida is very discouraging. For several years the Squth has been struggling to shake off the lynching habit, and with rather notable suc-cess. Ten states had lynchings in 1926, seven in 1927, and five in 1928. One of the most important legal decisions affecting Harlem was an-nounced Tuesday, November 19, when

the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court declared unconstitutional New York City's Emergency Rent Law. The law prevented landlords of apartments which rent for \$15 or less room a month from raising rents unless they could prove to the courts that the increases were reasonable. The decision of the Supreme Court

leaves landlords free to immediately erve notice of increases. While the rooms which rent for \$15 or less are distributed over the city, most of them are on the lower East Side and in Harlem, the East Bronx and Williamsburg, Brooklyn. But it will be crowded Harlem that will suffer most, for when the State Emergency Law expired last May, and before the city law passed thou-





The meeting was given eight or ten columns of space in the local pa-pers and both the News and the Journal commented favorably upon the Commission's work.
