



# White Workers' Threaten to Mob

TACOMA, Wash., May 15.-Hostilities that broke out recently in the White River Valley near Kent between Americans and Filipinos and spread to Vashon Island cast an ominous shadow on the Puyallup Valley farmers who employ the islanders.

Following the dynamiting of two houses, the stabbing of a white man, and injury to two Filipines on Va-shon Island, warrants were obtained in Seattle today for the arrest of five white men and two Filipinos.
The situation on the island is re-

ported tense but quiet.

Both Charles W. Orton, Pierce county port commissioner, and his brother, Ed Orton, who operates ranches near Sumner in the Puyallup Valley, have received letters promising summary action unless the twenty-six Filipinos they employ are discharged, they reported to Sheriff Desmond here. The letters were decorated with skulls and crossbones. Other ranchers are fearing trouble and have appealed to county officers for protection.

#### 200 Filipinos Driven From Homes

SEATTLE, Wash. -Four Filipinos were reported to have been abducted and dozens of others were driven from their camps in Kent, twenty miles south of here last week, when forty white laborers raided several ranches on which the Malays had been employed. State and county officers hastened from the Seattle district into which about 200 Filipinos were said to have been imported recently to replace white farm labor. Filipinos were paid 25 cents an hour for their work, while the borers had been given 50 cents an


