

father died. Sir Phipps married the young widow of John Hill, a well-known merchant. She was the daughter of Captain Roger Spencer, spoken of in the language of the times as "s person of good fashion."

Sir Phipps was successively shepherd, a carpenter, and a trader and in 1687 recovered from swrecked Spanish ship off the coas of the Bahamas bullion plate and reasures valued at several million dollars, from which the British government awarded him the equal to \$1,500,000. This gained him knighthood and the appointment as


heriff of New England. In 1690 he captured Port Royal (now Annapolis) in Nova Scotia, but in the following year in a naval attack on Quebec. through the influence of Increase Mather, Sir Phipps was appointed first Governor of Massachusetts.

During his reign this Negro Gov-ernor put an immediate stop to the witchcraft persecutions. He ap-pointed a commission of seven magistrates to try all such cases. 
