GENEVA, June 18 .- More and more clothes are being worn by the natives of Tanganyika, the League of of Nations Mandates Commission learned today from the British representative, Mr. Jardine, Secretary General of the administration of that African mandate. Imports of cotton goods, he said, had risen from 25,000,000 yards in 1924 to 37,
