# If Our Money Is Good Enough, **Our Boys and Girls Are Good Enough, Rev. Abbott Preaches**

This Simple Proposition Is Based Not. On Prejudice **But Only Upon Cooperation** 

ST. LOUIS, Mo .- Last Sunday at Union Memorial M. E. church, before a large congregation, Rev. B. F. Abbott, the pastor, preached a sermon-ette on "Spend Your Money Where You Can Work." He said:

This matter of spending our dollars where we can get a return in employment is fundamental in our group success. It is a simple propodice but co-operation. All groups, ex cept the Negro, have always spent their money where it gives the greatest return and the waking up to this fundamental plan on the part of Ne-groes is the most significant move made in years. We have had all sorts of campaigns, but none of them are as important as this campaign for jobs. The St. Louis American, the newspaper that is leading the campaign here in St. Louis not only needs to be congratulated but should be supported. It is rendering a very valuable service to the city, to white as well as black.

"The idea of making one's support off of one group and giving employment to another is an insult that we don't have to suffer. We have always been impartial in our trading, but since the other man refuses reciprocate, we must be partial in our demands. In the stores where we trade we should see to it that our boys and girls, our own kind, are given a chance to earn an hones living. First of Seven Atlantans Indicted for Divinity Student's Death

Atlanta, Ga .- T. L. Martin, one seven white men charged with Nagro college student, was guilty of voluntary manslaughter in Superior Court here today.

The jury set sentence from 12 to 15 years in the State penitentiary. The youth, a divinity student, was Majesty shot to death on June 15 at a public

The State charged he was killed without provocation by a party of seven men, while the defense plead-ed that the men went to the school grounds to hold the Negro for officers after he was alleged to have insulted two white women.

A few days later a mass meeting of Negroes held in a church was broken up with a tear gas bomb, which police said was later an attempt was made on the life of the Rev. Charles B. After the burning of the Hubert home, prominent white residents of Atlanta gathered and signed a letter to civic organizations and civic leaders, asking contributions for the restoration of the home. Many persons contributed.

Fellowmen of the Negro Race, Greeting:-

As President-General of the Universal Negro Improvement Association, 1 think it is necessary to give an explanation as affecting the good and welfare of the Organization at this time. As head of the movement it is my duty to so act as to conserve the interest of the Organization at all times. In keeping with this, I have, since the rising of our Convention of 1929, allowed certain persons whom I held in grave suspicion to prove by their acts whether they were sincere or not in the effort to advance the cause to which we pledge ourselves.

### MISTAKES OF PAST

The mistakes of the past have acted as valuable experiences to prevent us from carelessly entering into the same blunders again. It was with that in view that there was a delay in immediately putting forward certain things we decided on at the Convention. 
