"With reference to the position of Senator Cole L. Blease in regard to the subject of lynching, permit me to suggest a constitutional amendment to make possible the enactment of a bill by the general assembly of South Carolina to read as follows:

Be it enacted by the general as-sembly of South Carolina, that any Negro who seduces or rapes a white woman, or any white man who se-duces or rapes a Negro woman shall thereby forfeit the right of trial by jury and shall be lynched, and any law to the contrary is hereby re-

While this suggestion has caused much comment, due to the fact that it legalizes the lynching of white men, the seduce or rape colored women. it will never appeal to Senator Blease, the self-appointed champion of white supremacy and the protector of the virtue of white women.
