





"Two Negroes hanged in Mississippi on September 10 make the total of lynchings for the year eighteen so far as against twelve for 1929. This increase makes agitation for a federal anti-lynching law the more effective, and arrangements have already been made for the drafting of such a bill and for its introduction in the coming session of Congress. In 1922 a federal anti-lynching law passed the House of Representatives by a vote of 230 to 119, only to be defeated by a filibuster in the Senate. But after such a close squeak, the annual number of lynchings decreased for a time; and public sentiment, expressed through the more responsible of the newspapers and through this national shame. It is not unlikely that a federal law would receive an even kindlier reception now than it did eight years ago. Gradually it has come to be true that the lynching mob is made up of the more irresponsible elements of the community and at least in public its acts are disavowed by respectable persons. Moreover the Negro is becoming an economic power in the community; not only his labor but his property has value. This last, of course, will weigh the scales in favor of the federal law, if it is passed. Not his champions among the white race but his own efforts toward making himself a factor to he respected in the community will be the means of protecting the Neero from lawlessness." (Italics ours)
