Mr. Allen will review to organize the people of every comers are weighed by avoirdupois weight in which there are 7,000 grains to the pound, while gold is weighed by troy weight in which there are only 5,700 grains to the pound. Therefore a pound of feathers weighs 1,240 grains more than a pound of gold. The ounce cannot be taken as a unit of comparison because it is different in the two syystems. Using the same system of weights, of course a pound of gold and a pound of feathrs would weigh the same. - The
