



Foreign News Briefs

New Finds Shed Light On Site of Bucheum

CAIRO. - New light has been thrown on the history of the site of Rritish statesman, delivering the Rectorial address at Edinburgh Uni-Bucheum, near Armant in the Nile Valley, as a result of excavations under the auspices of the Egyptian Exploration Society.

The operations first commenced o the Bakaria, where the cows, mothers of the sacred Buchis bulls, were buried. When finally reached, most of these burials, which were Ptolemaic in date, were found to be ill preserved. One head, however, was discovered with the gilding on it intact. The comparatively good state of the gilt was due to the fact that the linen wrappings had been covered with pitch when gilded, whereas in other cases the gilt had been laid on plaster over the linen wrappings. Besides this, one mummy was found solidly waxed and was thus raised in its entirety with its bier.

and preserved in a similar manner. was found to be mostly of the Roman period. The cows here were buried in red brick vaults. In a passage was the stela of the Emperor Commodus and four offering tables, three of which were inscribed. In a deep pit, dividing the southern and northern passages was found a cow burial, probably of a late dynastic date.

In one tomb which was cleared was discovered a stone pavement under which was a mud brick ramp leading to a vaulted tomb. This tomb, which was of a late dynastic date produced some broken pottery. Hitherto, Turkey has allowed herself to be influenced by Russia regarding matters which come under the purview of the League of Nations.

The decision of the Turks and Russians not to go in for naval rivalry in the Black Sea is welcomed as if will result in economy for both nations and may also help preserve peace in the Near East. A few months ago Turkey concluded a sim ilar arrangement with Greece, so her naval needs are now expected to be come small.
