WASHINGTON, D. C.—There are seven Negro insurance companies operating in the District of Columbia. J. E. Hall, Jr., prepared statistics of these companies showing total income, \$8,162,747.96; assets, \$13,505,-932.96; liabilities, \$11,942,897.01; capital stock, \$1,050,000.00; capital and surplus, \$1,710,803.25; insurance in force, \$162,899,536,00. The premiums collected by these companies in the District of Columbia alone amount to \$334,849.20 on 27,311 policyholders. These policyholders have certificates to the amount of \$5,894,245.14, insurance in force.

The sum of \$196 was raised and turned over to the National Training School for Women and Girls by the Insurance Managers Association this week. Most of this sum was realized from a benefit reception given at the Masonic Temple, March 12. The association has set a goal of \$500.

ATLANTA.—Unemployment is proportionally greater among Negroes than among white people throughout the country, according to a report of the National Urban League made public here today through the Commission on Interracial Cooperation.

The report, base dupon an extensive survey, said that generally the Negroes in the South were faring better in keeping jobs than in the North, but that in many cities Negro unemployment was from four to six times greater in proportion to population than white unemployment. St. Louis was cited as showing the great-

Louis was cited as showing the greatest disproportion, Negroes there numbering 9 per cent of the population and 'providing 66 per cent of the city's total unemployed.

American Negroes Oppos "It would hardly seem out of place to remark that while the highly edu-cated Negroes' of this country oppose the teaching of Negro culture these leaders of the West Indies are boldly demanding it. The opposition of Negroes to the movement, however, is not without 'reason' from their point of view. They say that their own race has no history to compare with that of the Hebrews, the Greeks, the Latins, and the Teuton. Our children, then, should not waste time with insignificant affairs of Negroes and their backward culture. The Negro. then, must spend his days admiring others and thereby he may accidentally become something himself.

"Some of the highly educated Ne-groes' tell me that I am doing wrong to invite attention especially to the race. They say that we are not Negroes. We are Americans: and men the you go around talking about the Negro race in the foreground in such a way as to cause a reaction of other races against us."
