Spanish King **Quits Throne**; Now in Exile

Republic Is Proclaimed; Populace Cheers Abdication as Alfonso Bows

TO POPULAR WILL

MADRID.—King Alfonso XIII, the last of the Bourbons, yielded his throne today and Spain became a republic.

The monarchy, which had stood proudly for fifteen centuries, with only one brief intermission, was toppled over in a few breathless hours this afternoon without a drop of bloodshed. The Republican government, headed by Niceto Alcala Za-mora as first President, is installed peacefully in Madrid and the Republican flag is flying everywhère in the country.

Through the blackness of this moonless night Alfonso, accompanied only by the Duke of Miranda, his is understood, is speeding toward Cartagena, where he will board a ship for Marseilles. The King left the palace by the garden gate and got out of Madrid before any one was aware of it. An attempt was made to cloak the fact that he had left the palace and his destination is being kept as secret as possible. Leader of Native Liberians Tuskegee Lead Very Vital

Says President Hoover in Address Acclaiming 50 Years of Its Service

PATRIOTIC LOYALTY

Lauded; Calls It Greatest Single Factor in Negro's Progress

TUSKEGEE INSTITUTE, Ala.-The voice of President Hoover, raisec in tribute to Booker T. Washington, modern prophet of the Negro race resounded through the chapel here today as the climax of the celebration of the golden anniversary of the founding of Tuskegee.

President Hoover was not here in person, but his speech was carried over the wires from Washington and concurrently broadcast over two national networks. He spoke from the Lincoln study in the White House where the Emancipation Proclamation was signed.

He was the fourth White House occupant to address Tuskegeeans on Founders' Day. The others were President Roosevelt, who spoke in 1905; William Howard Taft, then Secretary of War, in 1906, and Calvin Coolidge, when vice-president, in

Citing the "complete economic and cultural destitution" from which the Negro started after emancipation. Mr. Hoover stressed the progress the race has made and credited the schools with being the greatest single factor in the advance.

More than 2,000 persons heard the program, which was interspersed with the singing of Negro spirituals by the institute choir. They were crowded in the chapel, or gathered in other small auditoriums or on the elvetv lawns, where amplifiers carried the programs to them.




