MEXICO CITY, Mexico. MATEXICAN merchants have found able allies in their fight against. the formidable competition that is being offered them by foreign street and house-to-house peddlers, "hole-inthe-wall" shopkeepers, installment plan vendors, and public market tradesmen. Housewives of the -national capital, and several of the larger cities of the republic, have pledged their practical support to the nationalistic campaign that is now being waged throughout the country to deal exclusively with Mexican merchants and to buy, insofar as is possible, nothing but Mexican made merchandisc. These pairiotic ladies have formed an organization which is called "The Front of Action League of Mexican Women." The group has 3,000 members alone in the Federal District, which, like the District of

The League resulted from the campaign against numerous small foreign concerns and individuals which are flourishing in Mexico and making difficult the plight of native macchandisers. Mexican merchants' beganizations allege that most of their foreign competitors, who operate upon a small scale, are doing business unfairly, and charge that these peois the hand that rules the world" is ple evade paying taxes, and are able a paraphrase of the old saying about to underself native merchandisers because they employ compatriots who are content to work for staryation wages, and that most of the goods they sell are smuggled. The agitation has been chiefly directed against Arab, Syrian, Turkish, Russian, Poiish and Jewish small merchants and peddlers. Various Syrian and Jewish. trade associations in Mexico City have stoutly denied these allegations.

Prominent Mexican merchants who are moving spirits in the nationalistic campaign are enthusiastic in ttheir praise of their housewife silies. They point out that practically all of these women are responsible for distributing the family's household funds, that the buying of much merchamilise and other products is simest entirely in their hands. They count upon these indies to prove a big tactor in the winning of their war, and are confident that, as a result of the efforts of the League, there will be a big slump in business for small scale foreign merchandisers and a gratifying increase in trade for astive merchants.





Steel City Built on Sands Will Have Celebration-Fifty Races in Parade

GARY, Ind .- The Steel City of the Sand Dunes commemorated today its twenty-fifth birthday and the attainment of 100,000 population.

Early in 1906, the late Elbert H. picked from the storm-scarred sand shores of Lake Michigan the site of the United States Steel Corporation's inland centre. Once a Po-tawatomie village was there. This will be our metropolis, he predicted. "We'll build near the railroad junction of Chicago, where acres of land can be had for almost the asking midway between the ore regions of the North and the coal lands of the South and East."

Hundreds of millions of dollars were dumped on the dunes. Dredges scooped out a harbor where waves washed unmolested since gla ciers formed the Great Lakes. The planners provided for a city forty-two miles square. Trees were planted where tumbleweeds had thrivedand today there are shady lawns. At the lake's edge, the steel plant arose. Miles of ingots crept from the mills to all parts of the world.

The band that built the Steel City gathered tonight at the Pioneer Sc ciety of Gary banquet. Hundreds of other pioneers came—men and women from all corners of the country

who made their stake in steel.

William P. Gleason, who super vised the building of the steel plant presided. Beside him was Captain H. S. Norton, who as agent of the Gary Land Company, did more than one else to develop the city. William A. Wirt, the Indiana school master, author of the Gary "Work-Study-Play" school system, also was

The celebration will continue three days. Tomorrow the steel plant wil shut down and thousands will parade down Broadway. Fifty racial groups will participate.

The Chamber is scheduled to vote Wednesday on the treaty between Hayti and the United States provid for American officials to head certain departments of the govern ment. The President won a victory in the Chamber when a motion fo revision of the constitution to eliminate election of Deputies next year was defeated.

Rangoon Editor Sees India as Market for The United States

W. J. Grant, editor of "The Rangoon Times," who is in New York on a tour of the world, said yesterday at the Bristol that "once the present political problems are settled, India will absorb Western manufactured goods as a sponge absorbs water."

Since fully 90 per cent of the 300,-000,000 Indians make their living on the land, Mr. Grant declared that when the production of rice, jute, maize and the like is put on a modern basis the demand for machinery will be enormous. Read and additional rail construction are urgently needed at present. Any advance in the agrarian industry demands a corresponding advance in communications. This would mean a strong market in India for motor cars, road construction appliances aid raffway equip ment.

Once politics is "out of the way," Mr. Grant said, "I am certain that it will tax the capacity of the West to supply the requirements of the East." He said that both India and Burma will continue agrarian for at least another century and that even now both countries were "full to overflowing with raw materials." He called Gandhi the greatest man in India since Akbar the Creat.

Mr. Grant, who is author of the lovel "Forbes Ingram," is studying novel world economic conditions. He has already visited Ceylon, Australia. New Zealand, Fiji and Canada. The Rocky Mountains, "for boldness and almost terrifying shearness" he thought superior to the Himalayas or the Alps.
