Compromise

In the great fight for the conservation and the acquiring of the things worthwhile, there is no middle ground, but everybody is strik-ing without compromise toward the self acquirement of all that is possible. It is not so much a selection as duty, and so there is now a mighty urge seeking to bring every unit of the Negro race into the frame of mind and disposition to selfishly grapple with the problems and see them executed.

The Europeans have long estabfished themselves in this line of human action. The Asiatics, chiefly the Japanese and the Chinese, and the Indians, have not allowed the grass to grow under their feet. It is now left to the Negro—the African at home and abroad—to so focus his mind toward the things that will give him a place, not unworthy among the other groups, so that in the end he will be one with the rest.

Be a Power Worthy Of Man

The Negro should not be discouraged, because he is the last to make the effort to establish himself in the world as a power and a force not unworthy of man. If he had not so decided, he would be still regarded and kept as a slave, but he has learned his lesson well, the lesson

GENEVA.—At the Meeting of the nternational Congress on African International Children, a strong speech was dewelfare work but in emancipation from foreign control. The African demanded self - determination and self-Government.

The startling assertion that in one part of Africa children were being produced specially for the slave trade and a considerable trade was going on in the exchange of children for arms and ammunition, was made at the International Conference on African children by John Harris, representing the Anti-Slavery Society. He added that the children seemed to be only raw material in Africa, the price of which was appreciating to-

Mr. R. V. Varnon, Assistant Secrewas convinced that there was no general cruelty to children in Africa, though it is possible there were cases in which work beyond their strength might have been forced upon them in the normal course as members of a family or tribe.







The will controversy involves most acutely Mrs. Beatrice Henderson Wholean, alleged granddaughter of Mrs. Henderson, who, in one will was cut off completely, and, in another, bequeathed only \$100: This is said to have been caused by two happenings. The first involved a suit which Mrs. Wholean began when Mrs. Henderson sought to give one of her mansions to the United States Government to be used as a home for vice presidents. Mrs. Wholean fought that move and went so far as to insist that Mrs. Henderson was not competent to handle her estate. The second matter is alleged to have been information which came to Mrs. Henderson indicating that Mrs. Wholean was not really her granddaughter, but had been adopted.

The bulk of Mrs. Henderson's estate in one of the wills was left to a nephew and niece in New York. the same document, \$200,000 was bequeathed to Jesse Shima, her young Japanese secretary. It was learned later that Shima had also profited another \$100,000 by purchasing from Mrs. Henderson for \$100, the home of Nicaraguan legation which is valued at \$100,000.
