To Tell Race by Smile

BALTIMORE, Md. - Dr. Ernst Huber, professor of anatomy at Johns Hopkins University here, has a theory about facial expressions. Dr. Huber thinks each race has a different kind of smile. The professor made a limited study of the facial muscles of Negroes, whites and Chinese and reached the conclusion that the white man has a smile all his own.

"In the responsive faces of the whites," he says, "we notice espe-cially in the upper region of the face and about the mouth a great range of varied expressions with many modulations. The mouth, even closed, may serve as an admirable index of character or mental state. A slight muscle contraction induced through complex association of ideas may produce a fine gentle smile.'

But the Negro cannot be expected to have this kind of a smile says the learned doctor. He continues:

"The less differentiated, coarsely bundled mimetic musculature typical Africa who was educated in the bundled mimetic musculature typical of the Negro and the greater thickness of the skin render this improbable."
