




SELLING CLOTHES NATIONALLY ON MODERATE INVESTMENT

Some Negro editors brought up in the tradition of gabbing have deplored the shortness of his speech, but we admire it for covering so much in so short a time of two and a half minutes.

No doubt he uttered a spien-did sentiment when he said: "It is vital in a democracy that the public opinion upon which it rests shall be an informed and educated opinion. The Negro race and educated opinion. The Negro race comprises 10 per cent of our population, and unless this 10 per cent of our population, proportionately with the rest of the popuproportionately with the fest of the popu-lation, it cannot pull its proper strength at the oars of our pressing problems of democracy. To provide this development requires trained leadership, and I conceive that to be the function of Howard University." But it seems that as soon as he got away from the presence of dark

He has even refused to be photographed with them. His policy has all along been a lily-white one. And to cap it al, his special representative at the Chicago convention, Postmaster General Brown, explained that Mr. Hoover had expressly instructed to Mr. Hoover had expressly instructed to eliminate the Negro influence in the Re-publican politics in the South.
