Observe Historical Event

May 14 is known in East Lonion, on the southeast coast of the old cape Colony, as "Fingo Day," and this year it was the ninetyeighth anniversary of a signal event in British occupation: the freeing of 16,000 Fingoes—a native tribe who turned against their impl in the great Xosa War of 1934 and assisted the British troops.

Fingo Day has been faithfully observed for nearly a century; but in a few years' time it will be for-See Negro Opera gotten. For the Fingo race is dying out. The members of the tribe are abnormally unintelligent, and the primitive and unhygienic conditions under which they live whenever possible have resulted in a gradual diminution of their num






