Sherwood Anderson, Theodore Dreiser and Upton Sinclair, lead ing American literary figures, re-cently issued a call to all organiza-tions and individuals opposed to war to participate in a United Congress Against War in New York City, September 2nd, 3rd and 4th. Pointing to the actual wars now go-City, September 2nd, 3rd and 4th.
Pointing to the actual wars now going on throughout the world and the increased tension in Europe as a result of Hitler's Fascist regime, these writers renounce "dependence on statesmen and diplomats to preserve the peace of the world."

The appeal which was released by the American Committee for Struggle Against War, 104 Fifth Avenue, follows:




